

Ministry, explained that he founded the
Ministry "for those who are suffering,
for those who are caring for the
suffering, so that no one suffers alone."
Stephen Ministers provide one-to-one,
Christ-centered care to people
experiencing grief, unemployment,
hospitalization, loneliness, divorce,

financial stress, a terminal illness, or other life difficulties.

One care receiver said this: "I realized that my Stephen Minister was a safe person who wasn't going to share what I told her with anyone else."
