

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING SUNDAY, JULY 21




There will be a congregational meeting to elect the Associate Pastor Pulpit Nominating Committee and church officers immediately following the 11:00 service on the 21st.

WHAT IS STEPHEN MINISTRY?



Stephen Ministers Chris Agee and Ann Krueger recently completed a 6-day Stephen Ministry Leader Training program in

Orlando. At the conference, Dr. Kenneth Hauck, founder of Stephen Ministry, explained that he founded the Ministry "for those who are suffering, for those who are caring for the suffering, so that no one suffers alone." Stephen Ministers provide one-to-one, Christ-centered care to people experiencing grief, unemployment, hospitalization, loneliness, divorce, financial stress, a terminal illness, or other life difficulties.

One care receiver said this: "I realized that my Stephen Minister was a safe
