From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

All of us enjoyed reading the Lenten devotionals (*Local Pilgrim*) we sent out for the 47 days of Lent. Some of you told us the devotional was the first thing you reached for each morning. These came from the Presbyterian Outlook and we found them thoughtful and inspiring.

I wondered if the Lenten devotionals inspired you to look around your community or your life to take a thoughtful look at what God is doing right here, right now. The *Local Pilgrim* pieces looked at a cemetery, a playground, the emergency room of the hospital, even the local garbage dump.

I was noticing something on our church campus yesterday: the butterflies our church and school children decorated, that staff member Carol Riley mounted on sticks to place near entrances to the church. On Sunday one of the children pointed at one of the butterflies and happily told me: "I made that one!"

Those butterflies are such a simple gesture, lifting colorfully and joyfully the new life we know in the risen Christ. The butterflies also remind us of the presence of children and families on our campus, children who bring their own contributions to our life together. On Palm Sunday and on Easter the children were present. They hunted for eggs, they carried in palms, they sang for us. They made noise with their play, their questions, their chatter. But they lifted our hearts. I give thanks for the children and their families. I pray for them, as you do too, praying that God is with them and their families in the challenges as well as the joys. I pray that the church is there for them too, with love, acceptance, and gratitude.

That makes me a Local Pilgrim too.....

By the way, next Sunday (April 14), we begin a 10:00 Sunday class ("Parable Quest") for children pre-K through 5th grade. Can you help with that ministry? Could you be a substitute teacher or a helper in the class? Could you bring your children, grandchildren, or neighbor children? Can you pray for this new class? 

you can see the facilities and meet some of their staff! If you have visited the camp previously, there is a fee of \$16/person.




