Help That's Truly WANTED and NEEDED

The Edible Peace Patch

"To cultivate healthy minds and bodies through hands-on educational gardens." That's the motto of the R'Club's Edible Peace Patch. Do you like to teach? Do you enjoy gardening? This may be the opportunity just for you. Young hungry minds and bodies need your help. The Edible Peace Patch, which was begun in 2009 by several Eckerd College students, now works with eight Title 1 elementary schools in St. Pete, schools working with lower-income kids. Plus, there's one community garden. The schools' curricula are approved by the Pinellas County School Board.



"The children working with these gardens are seeing their science scores improve significantly," says FPC's Lynne Mormino. "These gardens are a real morale booster."

There are two ways you can get involved:

- First, you can help these children plant and/or weed their gardens on a
 weekly basis from August to May from 9 AM to noon. (With the current
 temperatures you may consider starting in a later month.) You can check
 the weekly volunteer calendar to see what school has a workday
 available.
- Or secondly, you can be a garden education volunteer to help teach a hands-on class of elementary children in their garden. This is an 8-week

commitment, once a week for 45 minutes each time.

St. Petersburg Free Clinic

St. Pete Mayor Issues Proclamation Recognizing Date of Ukrainian Independence

The excitement of FPC's congregation is growing as we anticipate the Kyiv Symphony Orchestra and Chorus concert on Sept. 17 at 4 PM. Especially meaningful is Mayor Ken Welch's Proclamation issued on August 10, 2023. It acknowledged the 32nd Anniversary of Ukrainian

Independence, August 24, 2023. His proclamation states the following:

"The City of St. Petersburg recognizes the importance of Ukrainian independence as the country of Ukraine continues to struggle and sacrifice to keep their land, freedom, culture, language, and democracy and . . .

St. Petersburg is home to a large Ukrainian Community, which include churches, civic and cultural organizations, and . . .

Ukrainian—American veterans and residents continue to make valuable contributions to the cultural fabric of St. Petersburg by sharing their rich Ukrainian history and heritage, while holding the shared collective values of freedom and democracy, and . . .

The City of St. Petersburg stands in solidarity with the people of Ukraine in commemorating their 32nd anniversary of Ukrainian Independence . . . and ask all citizens to join me in acknowledgement of this day honoring the people of Ukraine and their indomitable spirit of courage and resilience."

The free concert at FPC on September 17 will be presented by 28 Ukrainian women, professional musicians who tour to raise funds for their mission of aiding widows, orphans, war victims and others in need of hope and/or/physical comfort. Some of us have signed up to host the musicians. Others are providing food, supplies, and help for the two meals we'll be serving in Fellowship Hall.
