Members on a Mission

"Boy, were we surprised...I'm so excited!" exclaims new church member Sarah Helck. She and husband Greg decided to do a Neighborhood Thanksgiving Food Drive this year in partnership with First Presbyterian. What started with a hope and a dream ended with 271 pounds of food and 30 pounds of hygiene items delivered to the St. Petersburg Free Clinic, all in the church's name.

Sarah says she wrote up a flyer and handed out 100 of them in their Old Northeast neighborhood. "I'm going to do a lot more next year, maybe 300." She and her children took two hours to pass the flyers out. "By the time we returned home, several bags were already at our house." In the flyer she wrote, "The Free Clinic is special to us—Greg's Mom Abby was ... a passionate



volunteer before she passed. The Clinic also is a long-time mission of First Presbyterian." The Clinic is more than grateful, she wrote, for any and all food donations as well as any daily necessities, while listing examples of each.



In the flyer, Sarah also described the Helck family's long-time involvement with our church school, now called St. Pete Primary. "We recently became involved with First Presbyterian Church. The church was lucky enough to get Pastor Ginny Ellis; her passion, humor, and open arms not only to us, but also the community, were overwhelming." Sarah then continued in the flyer with a list of upcoming family events at FPC.

Thank you, Sarah and Greg and Preston, Emmi, Madison, and Grayson for having such an open heart and creative mind. Sarah says she would be glad to share her ideas with anyone wanting to start such a food drive in their neighborhoods next year. "This has been such a great way to meet our neighbors. We're going to make this an annual thing for our family."




Deacons Distribute Christmas Poinsettias

You can make your donation by:


- Mailing a card to the Church

ONE Christmas Morning Service Sunday, December 25 at 11 AM


Sound the Trumpets! Worship with us on Christmas Day as we join in concert with the brass orchestra and celebrate the birth of Our
