

# From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

I found this nativity picture of a happy baby Jesus. It seems to me that this image of Mary, Joseph, and baby Jesus is particularly awful. After all, Jesus looks way too happy. Now, don't laugh at me. Look at it yourself. Don't you think Jesus looks too happy? How can he be this happy if he was born here to die for our sakes? Remember: Mary ponders things in her heart...and there was no room at the inn...and smelly shepherds came to pay their regards. It's not as if Jesus came into a happy-happy-joy-joy kind of life.



But then again, Jesus was born a real, live baby. At first, he slept a lot and cried sometimes (never mind what the song says: I say he cried sometimes), and he woke up at night, and he needed his swaddling clothes changed. But

after a while, he learned to smile and laugh and brought delight to Mary and Joseph and whatever aunts and uncles were around. In fact, we know that, as an adult, Jesus liked to have parties and invite people to dinner. So, yes, he was probably just about this happy as a child.

We're just used to thinking of Jesus as Son of God and therefore different from us. But Christmas comes to remind us that Jesus the Savior came as Emmanuel, God-with-us, a baby, child of Mary, a boy who played and laughed and sang as he grew, like all boys and girls do. It's good to remember that and to know that only a Savior who is like us could also represent us in the heavenly court.

So let him be happy. Time for sorrow comes soon enough. He should have a chance to be a kid. Happy Birthday, Jesus! Be happy!

And, dear sweet Jesus, help us to know that we can be happy too, when we are your friends. For in your love, we are brothers and sisters of all people, children of God. Let us know that at Christmastime we can celebrate your love and joy as we give to those we love and to those who are in need.

Bradley Hunter Welch is increasingly in demand as a recitalist, concerto soloist, and collaborative artist. He is the 2003 First Place winner of the Dallas International Organ Competition and was also awarded the Audience Prize for the second time, having previously won it in 2000.

He has taught at Southern Methodist University and Baylor University and was Director of Music & Arts at Highland Park United Methodist Church in Dallas, TX from 2009-2014.


A native of Knoxville, TN, Dr. Welch holds the Doctor of Musical Arts, Master of Musical Arts, and Master of Music degrees, as well as the coveted Artist Diploma from Yale University where he studied with Thomas Murray and



Martin Jean. He also holds the Bachelor of Music degree from Baylor University where he studied with Joyce Jones.

To invoke an old Southern expression, Bradley Hunter Welch plays the organ like nobody's business. Between the virtuosity of the playing and the easygoing spoken commentary, he also proved that 'entertainer' and 'organist' needn't be mutually exclusive. It would be hard to play Widor any better than this....splendidly idiomatic and communicative. ~Dallas Morning News
