Dear First Folks,

It was lovely to be in the Sanctuary last Sunday, and to know of those who were worshipping with us on live-stream. Either way we can worship together, it is good! Pastor Megan was on vacation; I think I meant to mention that...she was enjoying some family time!

Next week we will again offer Coffee Fellowship after worship in the Fellowship Hall and on Zoom.

The Session has appointed committee/ministry chairs, who are now busy inviting members to be part of their ministries and scheduling their upcoming meetings. Please find the right spots to do what the wonderful hymn says: "to come and follow me if I but call your name." We hope you find your own name lifted up, so that you follow the Lord in new and powerful ways, with your heart, your talents, your gifts.

The Congregation's Annual Meeting will be held in the Sanctuary after worship on February 20. The three main things we will do at that meeting are: hear reports from church ministries for the year 2021, approve the 2022 salary package of your Associate Pastor Megan McMillan (you do not vote on mine because mine is considered a "temporary pastoral position"), and the election of the new Officer Nominating Committee, which will nominate new classes of elders and deacon or fill vacancies that occur.

> Bon Voyage! Concert Featuring: Pinellas County Center


### *for the Arts Women's Chorale* This Sunday, February 13, 2022 at 4:00 PM

The goal is to share books with other readers who want to recirculate their enjoyed books. LFLs are a source of community pride. There are over 140,000+ LFLs in the USA and 7 foreign countries.




### FFIM Annual Meeting - March 4

### College Scholarship Applications

# We will be accepting applications for college scholarships through February



**28th**. These scholarships include the Church Family and Ohrns Scholarships for undergraduates and the Osborne Scholarship for Theology students. We only require one application is for both Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 semesters (awards are split). The applicant needs to let us know if they only need it for one semester.

For further details about these scholarships, please contact the Church Office. To apply for any of these scholarships, you will need to include: 1) a completed application form (found <u>HERE</u>); 2) a copy of your most recent high school or college transcript; 3) a 500-word essay describing your involvement in churchrelated activities as well as extra-curricular and community involvement activities, why you want this grant, and what you expect to do following the completion of your education.

The Scholarship Committee will review the applications and the Session will approve the final awards. Successful applicants will be asked to provide proof of enrollment and acceptance by their educational institution. Funds for the scholarship will be sent directly to the institution so be sure to give the proper name and address to which the funds are to be sent.
