# GUEST MUSICIAN THIS SUNDAY: Sarah Shellman, violin

Sarah Shellman is currently principal second violin with The Florida Orchestra; she joined the ensemble as a section violinist in 2002. She last appeared as a soloist on the TFO Masterworks series in March 2011, performing Thomas Ades' Violin Concerto *Concentric Paths*. She's also been

featured on the Coffee series programs performing *Winter* and *Spring* from Vivaldi's *The Four Seasons* and Bach's *Concerto for Two Violins in D minor* with Nancy Chang. She is an advocate for the performance of works by living composers as well as for the expansion of diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives within the classical music profession.

Shellman graduated from the Oberlin Conservatory of Music in 1998 with a bachelor's degree in music and the University of Houston in 2000 with a master's degree in music. While living in Houston, she played with the Houston Grand Opera, Houston Ballet, and as a freelance musician. In addition to her work on the modern violin, she has also performed with several early music ensembles as a violinist, violist, and mezzo-soprano.

## From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

This coming Sunday is Transfiguration Sunday, the last Sunday before Ash Wednesday and Lent. The story tells us of Jesus going up the mountain with

Peter, James, and John. There on the top, Jesus meets up with Moses and Elijah, giants in the history of the Jewish people. There they are transfigured, glowing with light, conferring with each other. Peter and the Zebedee brothers are terrified, the story tells us, and I get that. It sounds frightening to me for sure. Jesus floating in the air over the mountain, talking to long-dead prophets. Good grief. Imagine seeing something like that. Peter, James, and John fall on their faces. But next thing they knew, Jesus is touching their shoulders and saying: "Don't be afraid." That touch of Jesus' hand, that word to set fear aside and trust Jesus with all that life brings us, that is deep comfort to me, as it was on that day to P, J and J.

I know some of the fears we are feeling in our community, the fears and the hopes. Some that affects us all; some that affect the particular people we are. I believe that the touch of Jesus can bring us comfort, strength, and peace. I felt that touch last Sunday when I had the great privilege of baptizing Nanette Davis at her profession of faith in Christ. The touch of Jesus, felt in a splash of water on her hair and drawn in the shape of the cross on her forehead. That's what I pray for each of you, no matter what you are facing in your life. The touch of Jesus, the words he says: "Don't be afraid." Jesus is on the mountain with us, and Jesus will come down the mountain with us, to walk with us on our journey, wherever it takes us. Thanks be to God!



We only require one application is for both Fall 2023 and Spring 2024 semesters (awards are split); the applicant needs to let us know if they only need it for one semester.

- 1. a completed application form;
- 2. a copy of your most recent high school or college transcript;
- 3. a 500-word essay describing your involvement in church-related activities as well as extra-curricular and community involvement activities, why you want this grant, and what you expect to do following the completion of your education.

The Scholarship Committee will review the applications and the Session will approve the final awards. Successful applicants will be asked to provide proof of enrollment and acceptance by their educational institution. Funds for the scholarship will be sent directly to the institution so be sure to give the proper name and address to which the funds are to be sent. Questions? #### "Hope for Ukraine" Concert Postponed


