

American Bass-Baritone, Todd William Donovan, has been described by critics as a singer full of confidence, dominating the stage. He is known for his powerful and resonant voice and expressive acting. Mr. Donovan is comfortable both on the

Opera and Musical Theater stage where he has performed throughout the United States. Mr. Donovan has sung at the Classical Music Festival in Eisenstadt, Austria for eight seasons. Mr. Donovan's musical theater experience includes the roles of Amile de Becque in Rodgers and Hammerstein's *South Pacific*, Alfred P. Doolittle in *My Fair Lady*, the Baker in Sondheim's *Into the Woods*, Count Carl Magnus in *A Little Night Music*, and The Beast in Disney's *Beauty and the Beast*. Some of Mr. Donovan's operatic roles include: Figaro in Mozart's *The Marriage of Figaro*, Leporello in *Don Giovanni*, Olin Blitch in Floyd's *Susannah* (Naxos Records 2014 DVD), Scarpia in Puccini's Tosca, and Mefistofele in Boito's *Mefistofele*.

From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dear Friends,

I give thanks that Jean McCammon is just fine...as fine as a 101-year-old could ever be, after a black-out "pause" at church on Sunday. Though she has health issues, Jean loves to come to church each week with her care-giver. This past Sunday folks were concerned, and paramedics were called, but Jean turned out to be okay. Instead of getting in an ambulance, she chose to go back home in time for the great lunch menu at Westminster Palms that day. I have to say that I was deeply grateful for the care shown to Jean, with a number of people gathering quietly to care for her: including a nurse, a doctor, a deacon or two, retired minister Larry Duncan, two church staff members and perhaps others, all doing the right things. Meanwhile, the rest of the congregation and I carried on with our Annual Congregational Meeting, electing the 2023 Officer Nominating Committee and approving the new Rules of Governance document. A friend said: "A day in the life of a pastor, huh?" I just add: "It was a day in the life of the church, a good and caring church."

By the way, that annual meeting, which followed our two Sunday services, were separated by an Inquirer's Class at which we received four new members: two members and two associate members. It was a full church day indeed!

We know it has been a while since the elevator has worked properly...unfortunately, the parts needed for repair took a long time to find and install! But all repairs are complete and it's back open for business!






Concert: *Choral Classics* Featuring: The Master Chorale of Tampa Bay Friday, March 3, 2023 at 8:00 PM

STAFF MATTERS Five Questions of Kevin Clark

"I have no idea what drew me to music," says Kevin Clark, our Praise Band leader and trumpeter. Kevin has been Director of Contemporary Music here since October 2019. "My Mom always was in the church choir, so maybe that influenced me." Whatever, he's been playing the trumpet as long as he can remember, certainly in his high school and college bands and beyond.

As with many on our staff, Kevin's arrival in St. Petersburg and to First Presbyterian has been a roundabout path. As you know, the Personnel and Administration Committee profiles our staff around the time of their birthdays. Kevin's was two weeks ago, Sunday, February 12.



He was born in Poughkeepsie, NY, moved to Florida in 1978, where he grew up in Vero Beach with one brother, sons of the late Joe and Jan Clark. (Jan was a member of FPC and the Praise Band, starting in 2004). After high school, Kevin served two years on active duty with the US Navy as a Boatswain's Mate and Signalman. His two years completed, Kevin enrolled in Louisiana's Northwestern State University while also serving in the Naval Reserve's Seabees unit in Shreveport. He

graduated from NSU in 1996 with a degree in Music Education, specializing in trumpet with an eye on being a school band director.

Wanting even more training, Kevin applied to graduate school at the University of North Texas' College of Music. After an intensive audition and interview process, he was accepted into the school with a partial scholarship and went on to study Trumpet Performance. Why UNT, you may ask? "Because of its worldrenowned music program, which attracted many international students. A number of graduates have since gone on to become quite famous." As an aside, he says a classmate was Norah Jones, the award-winning jazz pianist and singer with more than 50-million albums to her credit. "This training gave me the grounding and credentials to be a professional trumpet player."

We have a few questions for you, Kevin.

Q1: What brought you to St. Pete?

Kevin: After grad school I took a job with Verizon in Dallas. In 2003, they had an opening in this area, and after sensing a strong call from God that I needed to be nearer to my parents, I requested a transfer here. A year later, I helped my mother and father evacuate to St. Pete after two hurricanes destroyed their condo in Vero and their insurer went belly-up. I left Verizon in 2005 to serve as Music Director and Band Leader for Carnival Cruise Lines. That's when I met my wife Jody. We don't have any kids other than two pups. I guess you can call me a Doggie-Daddy.

Q2: Just how many instruments do you play?

Kevin: Mostly the trumpet and flugelhorn. But I'm also learning the Irish penny whistle.



Q3: You clearly enjoy leading the Praise Band. What do you do to prepare?

Kevin: I first learn what the pastor's theme is for a Sunday. Then I select from 40-50 songs that our group knows. I try to keep current by listening to a lot of Christian radio to keep our library refreshed. We'll practice for an hour on Wednesdays and then for 30 minutes prior to the Connect service.

Q4: You work part-time for FPC. What's your day job?

Kevin: Well, Jody is a nurse with BayCare. A friend and I opened a music shop last July after Bringe Music closed its doors. We both had worked there. Our business—Tate Music and Repair—repairs band instruments and sells instrumental accessories. We now service 42 schools throughout six counties. As a freelance trumpeter, I play locally with multiple ensembles, including the Helios Jazz Orchestra, the Florida Wind Band, and the Bay Kings Band.



Q5: Have you cut any albums?

Kevin: No, but I've played on several. I'm on two songs of (the late) Marty Bailin's last solo album. (Bailin was co-founder, lead singer, and songwriter for Jefferson Airplane.)

She has received numerous awards and commendations from many professional organizations.

- 1. a completed application form;
- 2. a copy of your most recent high school or college transcript;
- 3. a 500-word essay describing your involvement in church-related activities as well as extra-curricular and community involvement activities, why you want this grant, and what you expect to do following the completion of

your education.

The Scholarship Committee will review the applications and the Session will approve the final awards. Successful applicants will be asked to provide proof of enrollment and acceptance by their educational institution. Funds for the scholarship will be sent directly to the institution so be sure to give the proper name and address to which the funds are to be sent. Questions? the 9 AM and 11 AM worship spaces during the months of February and March.


