
Praise Band Preview - Extraordinary Theme

Ash Wednesday is March 2

In the season of Lent, we enter into a forty-day fast that Jesus undertook in the wilderness. Through this dedicated period of selfexamination, we allow God to further shape us into the image of Jesus. We also align our

hearts with the suffering of Jesus as we move ever closer towards Holy Week and the event of the Crucifixion. The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, when we receive the imposition of ashes and are reminded that we are but dust, and to dust we shall return, and ends on the joyous morning of Easter, when we celebrate in Christ's resurrection.

Wednesday, March 2 marks the beginning of the Lenten Journey to Christ's

death and resurrection. As we begin this time of reflection and penitence, we invite you to two worship opportunities, which are open to all in our community:

- 1. From 1:00-3:00 PM, we will have a drive-through experience (which will include scripture, prayer, communion, and imposition of ashes) in the front circle drive, and
- 2. At 7:00 PM, we will have a Taizé-style worship service in the Chapel, also offering communion and the imposition of ashes. Jack Rain will be there and will be playing the Taizé pieces of the service. These are such a blessing to sing and ponder. Taizé worship is a contemplative service centered around music, prayer, and silence, to quiet the mind, open the heart, and feed the soul. It is a simple, meditative form of worship, calling us to dwell deeply on Christ's presence around and within us.


7 Mission Items for 7 Sundays of Lent





HOW CAN I PARTICIPATE IN THE LITTLE FREE LIBRARY AT FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH?


Our congregation always welcomes a new outreach program. The Little Free Library (LFL) will provide ways for members to share in such a program as well as being a very positive addition to the northeast neighborhood of St. Pete.

Ways to be involved include: sharing books through the LFL, spreading the news of the newly-opened library, helping with upkeep, cleaning, and checking on the library regularly. These are all small non-time consuming projects. The LFL is self-funded by interested members and groups and is maintained by one Steward and seven Librarians.

Our LFL will be located on Beach Drive NE at the corner of 8th Ave NE. The design of our LFL will draw its influence from architectural details of our church building. As users are choosing books, the front of First Presbyterian Church will be visible right behind the library.

College Scholarship Applications -

Deadline is Feb 28!

We will be accepting applications for college scholarships through February 28th. These scholarships include the



Church Family and Ohrns Scholarships for undergraduates and the Osborne Scholarship for Theology students. We only require one application is for both Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 semesters (awards are split). The applicant needs to let us know if they only need it for one semester.

For further details about these scholarships, please contact the Church Office. To apply for any of these scholarships, you will need to include: 1) a completed application form (found <u>HERE</u>); 2) a copy of your most recent high school or college transcript; 3) a 500-word essay describing your involvement in churchrelated activities as well as extra-curricular and community involvement activities, why you want this grant, and what you expect to do following the completion of your education.

The Scholarship Committee will review the applications and the Session will approve the final awards. Successful applicants will be asked to provide proof of enrollment and acceptance by their educational institution. Funds for the scholarship will be sent directly to the institution so be sure to give the proper name and address to which the funds are to be sent.
