In on-campus news:

 We are continuing many of the things we started for our January/February focus called Extraordinary Time. You should peek into the Chapel to see the Prayer Stations set up there, and find a time to come for 10 or 20 minutes of quiet time in God's house. We invite you to come and experience the prayers stations in the Chapel. There are seven stations in which you can take time to pray and meditate. The chapel



- A table-top Japanese Zen Garden



College Scholarship Applications




We will be accepting applications for college scholarships through February

28th. These scholarships include the Church Family and Ohrns Scholarships for undergraduates and the Osborne Scholarship for Theology students. We only require one application is for both Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 semesters (awards are split). The applicant needs to let us know if they only need it for one semester.

For further details about these scholarships, please contact the Church Office. To apply for any of these scholarships, you will need to include: 1) a completed application form (found HERE); 2) a copy of your most recent high school or college transcript; 3) a 500-word essay describing your involvement in church-related activities as well as extra-curricular and community involvement activities, why you want this grant, and what you expect to do following the completion of your education.

The Scholarship Committee will review the applications and the Session will approve the final awards. Successful applicants will be asked to provide proof of enrollment and acceptance by their educational institution. Funds for the scholarship will be sent directly to the institution so be sure to give the proper name and address to which the funds are to be sent.
