

#### From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

*DISAPPOINTMENTS* – So many of us are disappointed about where we are with COVID-19 as the year 2022 begins. We had come to enjoy being together, worshiping together, singing together, smiling at one another. Even when wearing masks, being together was a deep relief and joy. But as you know, at the end of December, the Session made the tough and prayerful decision to go back to online worship only.

We did this after Christmas Eve because there were some reported positive cases among our own congregation, positive cases that meant a number of church folk may have been exposed. Fortunately, of those tested, most came back negative. But as we have seen, the recent rise in COVID case numbers in Florida has been alarming. This is heartbreaking -- heartbreaking for the church, for the community, and for the world. Those who have been vaccinated and have had boosters are faring well; that is the very good news. The Session and the church staff are hopeful that this Omicron COVID wave will pass by quickly and we will be able to return to in-person worship soon. Meanwhile, I join everyone in expressing my own frustration and disappointment. While the comfort and joy of being together is agonizingly missing, it is critical that we take care of our worshiping and vulnerable congregation.

**EXTRAORDINARY TIME** – My friends, I have been planning a special time of worship and related activity for January and February. I have been calling this "extraordinary time," a time based on consideration of the Biblical story of Moses and the Burning Bush. I am disappointed that we will not start this time together in the Sanctuary. Nonetheless, please join me in reading and thinking about the story of Moses found in Exodus, especially Exodus 3:1-15.





The Burning Bush dominates our Sanctuary, with the immense and beautiful stained-glass sculpture and the colorful glass beading that runs through the Sanctuary. I want us to think together in the coming weeks about how that story represents our own call to discipleship and our church's call to mission. Please join me in this Biblical adventure!

<u>For this week</u>, we will be thinking about where we see God, how we recognize the extraordinary in our life, and what might be the burning bush for us, for me, for you, for this church.

<u>ALSO</u>: Pastor Megan and I will begin discussion and meditation time at 10:00 each Monday, called "Lectio Extraordinary," when we can further consider the text and theme of Sunday's Burning Bush sermon. To join us via Zoom Monday mornings at 10 AM, click <u>HERE</u>. We hope you will join us!

*MISSION* - Now that we have the Church Session back up to strength, we will re-organize ministries, including Mission, which has lacked a chair. In the meantime, for the month of January, I am asking that we support our presbytery's Beth-El Farmworker Mission in Wimauma, by gathering items that

will HELP THEM STAY WARM.


Items they have requested are:

- Bed sheets (twin/full)

#### From Dr. Cesar Davila, New Hope Clinic, Honduras Monday, December 20, 2021

Greetings and Blessings,



Hello, brothers and sisters. The pandemic statistics are the following: positive cases, 378.735 and deaths, 10,428 patients. As to the pandemic panorama, it is much better now than it was a year ago. Even as we are alert to the new variant Omicron, we hope that it won't result in a new rise of cases. Actually, there is a confirmed case of the variant Omicron in Costa Rica. I believe that it is a matter of days until we have our first cases in Honduras.

For our part, we are taking all manner of biosecurity measures in the clinic, for whatever rise in pandemic cases. What concerns the staff is the relaxing of health concerns in the population. For example, in the rural areas and in some cities, the people are not utilizing masks and do not wish to get vaccinated. This could result in a new outbreak of this Coronavirus variant.


We are coming to the end of this year 2021 with much sadness for the loss of our friends and family. May the Lord keep them and continue to protect us with His holy cloak.

The transition of the new government in Honduras will happen on January 27. The people of Honduras hope that this government will do things differently that will result in the change that returns the hope that builds a new country.

Every day we continue to take care of our patients in the three areas of service we offer to the communities that we service: Medicine, Dental, Laboratory. We are also helping with the campaigns of vaccinations against Covid and organizing clean-up operations in the communities because of the increase in cases of Dengue that is showing up on a national level. In Orica, the number of dengue cases is few, but we are taking measures to avoid an outbreak.

This week we will be in the clinic taking care of patients through December 23

and then begin vacation until January 3, 2022.
