AfghanTech, Bike Helmets, and Rides

What a good day, what a group effort!

Twenty-seven members and friends of First Presbyterian offered their various resources Saturday, April 30, to provide and retrofit 18 laptops/iPads, to contribute 24 bike helmets, and to offer transportation for the families resettling in St. Pete from Afghanistan.





In this picture Noman Raoufi (center left), a former emissary and interpreter for the U.S. generals in Afghanistan, and his friend Mohammad Hakim Kohdamani receive the computers and helmets from FPC media director Dave Aumack and Carlen Maddux, representing our Mission Committee. These will be distributed among the 28 members of the four families resettling in St. Pete's Pinellas Point area. To make this happen, FPC and our Mission Committee partnered with Lutheran Services and Westminster Communities.

The retrofitted computers will be used by our new neighbors to stay in touch with family and friends in Afghanistan and to help with their English-speaking and education skills, along with whatever else.

You may be unaware, but our church has at least one direct link with Afghanistan: Dave Aumack served several tours of duty there 2002-2013 as a pilot and safety mentor before retiring as an officer in the U.S. Air Force. He now is working hard to get his interpreter and family out of the country. (If you have any contacts, political or otherwise, who might be of help, please contact Dave through the church office.)

This four-hour project on April 30 was led by Dave and his IT buddy Mike Kelzer. There was considerable down-time as computers went through their slow recycling, so this gave friendships a chance to rekindle: "I saw folks I haven't seen in a long time." "I'm not sure how much my few skills were needed, but I enjoyed catching up with friends." A lot of hands made short order in readying these computers.

We are excited to begin a new 5th Sunday Mission tradition here at First Presbyterian Church! Every month that has a 5th Sunday, starting on Sunday, May 29th, we will have a Contemporary Worship Service in the Fellowship Hall at 10 AM where the FPC Praise Band will lead us in worship (this will be in place of the blended service that usually takes place in the Sanctuary at 10 AM).

At 11 AM, we will begin our on-site congregational mission project. This month, we will engage in packing condiment kits for the Missio Dei Community. Missio <u>Dei</u> is a worshipping community for unhoused folks in Pinellas County that covers a myriad of services: worship, food, laundry, advocacy and more.

Then, following the mission project, (around 12 PM), we will eat and fellowship

with one another in the Fellowship Hall. Kyle Brinkman, along with the CE& Fellowship Committee, will cook up some meats for us to enjoy. **We ask that folks bring a covered dish of salads, sides and/or desserts to share.** We hope to see you there! GriefShare is every Sunday at 4 PM, meeting virtually (via Zoom).

Whether your bereavement

experience is recent or not so recent, you will find encouragement, comfort and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, other family member, or friend. This program features biblical, Christ-centered teaching that focuses on grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. The 13-week DVD seminar features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by a small group discussion about what was viewed. This is a great opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. Don't allow fear of what others may think to keep you from what could help you. Confidentiality is very much a part of this program.
