PER CAPITA -- As a "connectional" denomination, we both receive and give support to our regional governing body: Tampa Bay Presbytery. Our support for Presbytery comes through Mission giving (that supports Beth-El Mission and Cedarkirk for example) and through the Per Capita that supports annual expenses of the Presbytery (their staff, website, etc). The per capita assessment, which our church pays for each active member of the church, is $\$ 33.48$ this year. First Presbyterian pays the per capita in full but you are invited to cover that charge yourself, if you are able to, by including the \$33.48 in your church giving. Every little bit helps! ## The Tree that Keeps on Giving

Our church's Giving Tree has been up for a couple of weeks now, and many are responding with interest and gifts. It stands at the entrance to our Sanctuary. As you may know,
this is a community Tree now with requests from several non-profit organizations rather than from just one at a time.

As a reminder, our Mission Committee's regular partners are: 1) CASA (Community Action Stops Abuse); 2) St. Pete Free Clinic; and 3) Lakewood Elementary School. However, the
 needs of other groups will also trim our Giving Tree from time to time.

Here are the requested items you'll find hanging on the Giving Tree when you stop to look it over:

- From CASA: air mattresses (with pump); blankets; bras/sports bras; hairbrushes/combs; socks (men, women, children); trash bags (30-gallon or 55 -gallon preferred); umbrellas; underwear (men, women, children); women's body wash.
- From St. Pete Free Clinic: jumbo packs of toilet paper; multiple packs of toothpaste; and multiple packs of no-scent deodorant. Also, if you have the time, please think about being a volunteer. The Free Clinic has big changes ahead for its We Help FRESH Pantry. It's returning to an indoorchoice option and opening TWO new drive-thru sites for a total of THREE locations to make available FREE FRESH groceries. To do that means they will need more volunteers than ever. The Free Clinic will be offering information sessions for potential new volunteers on Wednesday, May 25, and Tuesday, June 7. - From the R Club, which administers Happy Workers and Edible Peace Patch: Happy Workers' needs include: PJs, 2T-5T (T = Toddler); pull-ups, 2T-3T; underwear, 2T-5T; toothpaste/toothbrushes for children; socks, 2T-5T; T-shirts and shorts, 2T-5T. Edible Peace Patch's needs include: 10 boxes of Crayola markers; 10 rainbow sharpies; 8 pencil boxes; 5 pairs of adult gardening gloves; a white board (to use when teaching volunteers in the gardens).
- Lakewood Elementary School is closed for the summer, so none of its needs will be dangling from our tree until school re-opens.

## New Little Free Library Comes to the Northeast

Wirst Presbyterian Church is bringing books to the Teople with a new Little Free Library for neighbors and friends in the northeast area of St. Pete. Located near the public sidewalk at Beach Drive and 8th Avenue NE, the library features architectural elements inspired by those of the First Presbyterian Church building. Artist and church member Ronn Johnson oversaw the project from early design, to working with the builder, Dimitri Gruszka, and finally to painting the intricate artwork on the exterior of the library.

## GriefShare is every Sunday at 4 PM, meeting virtually (via Zoom).

Whether your bereavement experience is recent or not so recent, you will find encouragement, comfort and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, other family member, or friend. This program features biblical, Christ-centered teaching that focuses on grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. The 13-week DVD seminar features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by a small group discussion about what was viewed. This is a great opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. Don't allow fear of what others may think to keep you from what could help you. Confidentiality is very much a part of this program.
