The next time you are at the church, be sure to check out the collection and take a book you would like to read and leave a book (or 2) you would like to share with others.



FPC's Giving Tree

Unlike The Giving Tree in Shel Silverstein's children's

book, First Presbyterian's Giving Tree will keep on keeping on...keep on flourishing with opportunities for our members, friends, and neighbors to help respond to the needs of three local organizations your Mission Committee has chosen to partner with. Those organizations are **1**) CASA (Community Action Stops Abuse); **2**) St. Pete Free Clinic; and **3**) Lakewood Elementary School.



Our Giving Tree is now back up and will remain standing. Going forward, it will be a community tree. In other words, it will have requests from all three of our partnering organizations, not just from one as it has been in the past. Opportunities also will be hanging on the tree from time to time from other organizations as significant needs surface.

The needs may be for <u>physical items</u> or for <u>volunteer involvement</u>, either onetime or ongoing. Your Mission Committee will stay in close touch with our partner organizations, and others, and make you—our members, friends, and neighbors—aware of opportunities as they arise out in the community. We also will sponsor in-church workdays scattered throughout the year.

There's always a tension between asking too much and not asking enough, so the Mission Committee is trying its best to be mindful of your resources and the church's as we replenish First Presbyterian's Giving Tree.

What will the Giving Tree's cards be for?

The best way to answer that is with an example: Our most recent Giving Tree was for Lakewood Elementary students and families. Lakewood's 30 cards included such items as bath towels, dinnerware, and flatware. Ten of the cards also were for Publix gift cards—half for \$25 and half for \$50. All these items were directed to homeless families only.

And as mentioned above, there will also be volunteer opportunities.

What do I do when I pick a card from the Giving Tree?

When you pick a card from the Tree and return with the designated item, please attach the card to that item. A box will be available in the Sanctuary for you to leave the items. If you want to volunteer, that card will give you a specific organization's contact information (that way you won't have to go through a third party).

Every month that has a 5th Sunday, starting on Sunday, May 29th, we will have a Contemporary Worship Service in the Fellowship Hall at 10 AM where the FPC Praise Band will lead us in worship (this will be in place of the blended service that usually takes place in the Sanctuary at 10 AM).

At 11 AM, we will begin our on-site congregational mission project. This month, we will engage in packing condiment kits for the Missio Dei Community. Missio <u>Dei</u> is a worshipping community for unhoused folks in Pinellas County that covers a myriad of services: worship, food, laundry, advocacy and more.

Then, following the mission project, (around 12 PM), we will eat and fellowship with one another in the Fellowship Hall. Kyle Brinkman, along with the CE& Fellowship Committee, will cook up some meats for us to enjoy. We ask that folks bring a covered dish of salads, sides and/or desserts to share. GriefShare is every Sunday at 4 PM, meeting virtually (via Zoom).

Whether your bereavement

experience is recent or not so recent, you will find encouragement, comfort and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, other family member, or friend. This program features biblical, Christ-centered teaching that focuses on grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. The 13-week DVD seminar features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by a small group discussion about what was viewed. This is a great opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. Don't allow fear of what others may think to keep you from what could help you. Confidentiality is very much a part of this program.
