QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

Have you ever considered making a charitable gift from your IRA? If you are over the age of 70 1/2, perhaps you should! Here is a tax-savvy strategy that allows you to transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your traditional IRA directly to qualified charities, such as your church. If you are 70½, it is tax smart to fund your charitable gifts by Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs). These reduce your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) which may also reduce your Federal taxes, and surcharges on Medicare and Part D Drug Plans. Any amount processed as a QCD counts toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) and reduces the taxable amount of your traditional IRA

distribution. If you are over age 70 1/2, consider taking advantage of the QCD.

God called me to ministry later in life, after I retired from a lifelong career in early childhood education. I worked for many years for the Florida State University System and always regarded my work with children and families as a sacred calling, dedicating my working life to improving the quality of early childhood education for all children,



especially those from low-income families. My call to serve in ministry is a continuation of my desire to be of service to all God's people. Micah 6:8 guides my ministry - "what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" In seminary I spent almost a year working as a resident chaplain at Tampa General Hospital in Florida, where I learned much about ministering to the spiritual needs of people experiencing crisis and illness. My first ordained call was to serve the elderly as chaplain at Palm Garden Health Care Centers. Later I served the First Presbyterian Church in Jasper, Florida as interim pastor. In December, 2017 I was called to serve as Parish Associate at the First Presbyterian Church of Ocala, and am now joyfully blessed to provide pastoral care here at First Presbyterian Church of St. Petersburg.
