QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

Have you ever considered making a charitable gift from your IRA? If you are over the age of 70 1/2, perhaps you should! Here is a tax-savvy

strategy that allows you to transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your traditional IRA directly to gualified charities, such as your church. If you are $70\frac{1}{2}$, it is tax smart to fund your charitable gifts by Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs). These reduce your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) which may also reduce your Federal taxes, and surcharges on Medicare and Part D Drug Plans. Any amount processed as a QCD counts toward your **Required Minimum Distribution** (RMD) and reduces the taxable amount of your traditional IRA distribution. If you are over age 70 1/2, consider taking advantage of the QCD.
